

Transparency of Trade Association Dues Payments

Intuit is a dues-paying member of various trade associations that are organized under section 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code. These organizations help Intuit to further our public policy goals and desired business outcomes. Beginning in FY15 on an annual basis, Intuit publicly publishes a list of 501(c)(6) organizations to which we make dues payments through our Corporate Affairs function. Intuit also inquires with these organizations to understand what portions of our dues payments are used for lobbying or political contributions by these 501(c)(6) trade associations. If the trade associations can gather this information, it is included in our disclosed list.
